FROM ME AFTER APP. 20 MIN.

VERY SMALL DOVE (INCA SIZE OR SMALLER), QUITE UNIFORM
GRAY (BROWNISH TINCE). BLACK SPOTS ON WING COVERTS
AND TRIFLE ON BACK. BILL APPEARED DARK IN LIGHT I HAD.
LACKED SCALY EFFECT OF INCA DOVE. VERY SHORT ROUNDED
TAIL, DARK BROWN IN COLOR, SLIGHT SUGGESTION OF WHITE
EDGE (OUTER TIP) OF TAIL. THIS WAS MUCH MORE LIMITED

Description (continued):

THAN IN INCA DOVE. WHEN IT FLEW, IT SEEMED TO FLY VERY FAST AND ERRATIC, FLASHING SOME RUFOUS ON WING. IT APPEARED TO DROP TO GROUND, WHERE I COULD NOT SEE IT, OR LOOK ON FOOT, AS IT WAS POSTED PROPERTY. SLIGHT SCALY APPEARANCE ON HEAD - DID NOT SEE BREAST WELL.

Describe the bird's song and call, if given, including method of delivery, (i.e. from perch, in flight, duration):

NONE HEARD.

Describe the general and specific habitat in which you observed the bird:

THICK BRUSH AND COTTONWOOD SAPLINGS AT EDGE OF CATTAIL MARSH NEXT TO COZZENS LAKE.

How did you eliminate similarly appearing species?

INCA DOVE - HAVE SEEN MANY TIMES IN SW AND TWICE IN COLORADO. HAS A SCALY EFFECT ON BACK AND WING COVERTS, AND A RATHER LONG ^{TAIL} WITH WHITE OUTER EDGE. MOURNING DOVE - MUCH LARGER, VERY ELONGATED, TAIL LONG AND TAPERED.

What is your prior experience with this and similarly appearing species?

INCA DOVE — } SEEN FREQUENTLY IN SOUTH TEXAS
COMMON GROUND DOVE — } AND SOUTH ARIZONA.
