AND ONCE FLEW FROM ONE BRANCH TO ANOTHER.

THE BIRD WAS CLEARLY SOMEWHAT LARGER AND LONGER (ABOUT 2") THAN THE HOUSE FINCHES WHICH WERE ALSO IN THE TREE. IT WAS NOT NEARLY AS LONG AS A MORNING DOVE. ON FIRST VIEWING THE SCALLOPING MARKING ON MOST OF THE BIRD WAS WHAT STRUCK ME FIRST. THE SCALLOPING COVERED THE BREAST,

Description (continued):

HEAD AND THE WINGS OF THE BIRD. THE TAIL WAS CLEARLY QUITE LONG AND I COULD SEE THE WHITE OUTER TAIL FEATHERS TOWARDS THE END OF THE TAIL. THE BIRD NEVER FLEW LONG ENOUGH TO GET A REALLY GOOD LOOK AT THE TAIL, BUT WHEN IT FLEW THE CHESTNUT IN THE OUTER WINGS WAS OBVIOUS. THE BILL WAS RELATIVELY QUITE LONG AND WAS ALL DARK. THE EYE WAS RED WITH A BLUE EYERING WHICH WAS QUITE THIN. THE FEET WERE RED.

ROCK DOVE BY MUCH SMALLER SIZE, SCALLOPED APPEARANCE, SMALLER BILL ETC.
